Total Physical Response involves these main steps: Introduce the new vocabulary by stating the word or phrase and modeling the gesture. (Most teachers state or write the term in English just to make sure the exact meaning is clear.) The gesture can be doing the command itself, or something like an ASL sign that conveys the meaning.
