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A wave in which particles of the medium move in a direction perpendicular to the direction that the wave moves. Transverse waves are characterized by particle motion being perpendicular to wave motion. If a rope is stretched out horizontally & the end is vibrated back-and-forth in a vertical direction, a transverse wave would result.

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A wave is a disturbance that pppg propagates through space and time, usually with trans- fference of energy. While a mechanical wave exists in a medium (which on deformation is capable of producing elastic restoring forces) waves ofproducing elastic restoring forces), waves of electromagnetic radiation (and probably gravitational radiation))g,, can travel through vacuum, that is, without a medium.

a wave is traveling through a medium, the number of vibration cycles of a point on the medium per unit of time is defined as a wave's frequency many wave properties are dependent upon other wave properties. yet, one wave property is independent of all other wave properties.
