A placebo doesn't have to be a pill. It can be any inert or 'dummy' treatment. The placebo effect is the positive effect on a person's health experienced after taking a placebo. It is triggered by the person's belief in the benefit from the treatment and their expectation of feeling better, rather than the characteristics of the placebo.
