In 2017, women represented 15% of adults in jails and 7% of adults in prisons in the United States (Bronson & Carson, 2019; Zeng, 2019). While the number of incarcerated males has steadily declined, the number of incarcerated females continues to rise. Women have gender-specific health needs that correctional facilities must address.

### Women's Health Care in Correctional Settings

Female offenders are more likely to need medical and mental health services, child care services, and assistance in finding housing and employment. Following a comprehensive assessment, women with mental health disorders should receive appropriate treatment and case management, including victim services as needed.

### Women in the criminal justice system

Male and female inmates in state and federal prisons were equally likely to report having at least 1 of 6 impairments which include learning, speech, hearing, vision, mobility, or mental impairment. Female inmates (11%) in state prisons were more likely to report a mental impairment than male inmates (6%).

Health, mental health and substance abuse problems often are more apparent in jails and prisons than in the community. Incarcerated men and women are often diagnosed with health, mental health, and substance abuse problems after receiving care from a correctional health provider.
